Introduction

ADIRONDACK LIFE magazine was founded as a quarterly in Elizabethtown, New York, in 1969. In 1977 it began publishing six issues a year, adding a seventh—the Annual Guide—in 1990, and an eighth—the Collectors Issue—in 1998. In the mid-1980s, to help readers and researchers more easily locate specific topics covered in the magazine, ADIRONDACK LIFE published an index of volumes I–XV, compiled by Neil Surprenant, of Paul Smith's College. This index, for volumes XVI–XXX, covers the subsequent fifteen years of issues.

How to use this index: Each article from the most recent fifteen years of ADIRONDACK LIFE issues has been given its own number; numbers continue from the 1970–1984 index and start with 860. These are the numbers that also appear in the Subjects and Authors sections. They direct you to the issue and page where the article in question can be found. For example, if the subject you are looking for is boatbuilding, look up “boatbuilding” in the Subjects section. The first number is 905, which in the Titles section refers to “Thank You Nessmuk!” by Peter Hornbeck, from the August 1985 issue. If you are looking for all stories by Russell Banks, under “Banks, Russell” in the Authors section you will find three: numbers 1462, 1707 and 1971, which appeared in October 1991, October 1994 and February 1998, respectively.

A note from the editors: The names of contributors are not always consistent from one issue to the next; middle names and initials come and go, “James” can become “Jim,” and so forth. In this index, contributors' names appear as they did on their most recent work. Also, in the interest of brevity, editor's notes, letters to the editor and calendars of events are not indexed herein and must be looked up in individual issues.
